Adult Sunday School: Matthew 25 on April 14th, 21st, and 28th. Matthew 25 has become an important focus in the mission and ministry of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Specifically, it informs, inspires, and influences

our work on three strategic priorities: eradicating systemic poverty, dismantling structural racism and building congregational vitality. The adult Sunday school class will be considering how Matthew 25: 31-46 speaks to, and leads us to pursue, these areas of work. We also will look at three different ways of interpreting the biblical text: a literal/plain reading, a historical/critical reading, and a spiritual/symbolic reading. Join us as we read, reflect, and respond to how God's word speaks to us as we strive to live a life that reflects Christian love.
